

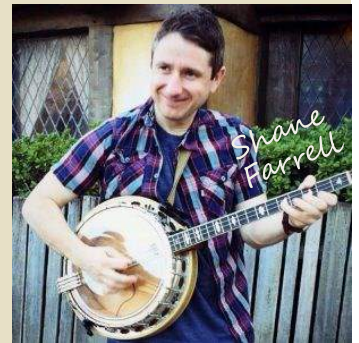
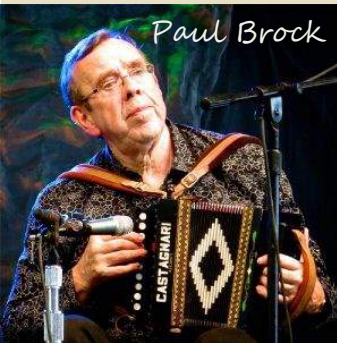

VOTER REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Illinois residents can register to vote at the library! Bring two forms of ID—one must have your name and current address.

- In-person voter registration deadline: Oct 9
- Online voter registration deadline: Oct 21
- Grace period voter registration: Oct 10-Nov 5*
- Election day registration at polling place: Nov 6**

*Register at Election Commission office or any early voting location. Those registering during the grace period who plan to vote in the upcoming election must vote at time of registration.

**Must have two forms of ID.

What's an IRAD? | Sat., Oct 6 @ 10 am

Attention genealogists, local historians, and generally curious people! If you've always wanted to know what's behind the doors of the [Illinois Regional Archives Depository](#) (IRAD), then be sure to join us as Bill Cook, on-campus supervisor for IRAD, offers a fascinating look at this remarkable research resource.

The [IRAD at Western Illinois University](#) is one of seven depositories in the state administered by the Illinois State Archives. It houses county and local government records that have been appraised as having long-term value and transferred to the Archives' custody, including death and marriage records, deeds, probate, tax, and naturalization records. The WIU-IRAD serves 16 counties: Adams, Brown, Calhoun, Fulton, Hancock, Henderson, Henry, Knox, McDonough, Mercer, Peoria, Pike, Rock Island, Schuyler, Stark, and Warren.

How to Die in Oregon—Documentary & Discussion

Sat., Oct 13 @ 1 pm

The free screening will be followed by a discussion with a moderator from Final Options Illinois, part of the Illinois End of Life Options Coalition, which also includes the ACLU Illinois, and Compassion and Choices.

In 1994, Oregon made it a legal right for people who are dying to cut short their suffering with a doctor's aid. That legal right also exists now in six states and Washington D.C.; throughout Canada; and in several European countries. Since 1994, more than 500 Oregon residents have taken their mortality into their own hands. In the Sundance Award-winning documentary *How to Die in Oregon*, filmmaker Peter Richardson gently enters the lives of the terminally ill as they consider whether – and when – to end their lives by lethal overdose. Richardson examines both sides of this complex, emotionally charged issue. What emerges is a powerful, life-affirming portrait of what it means to die with dignity.

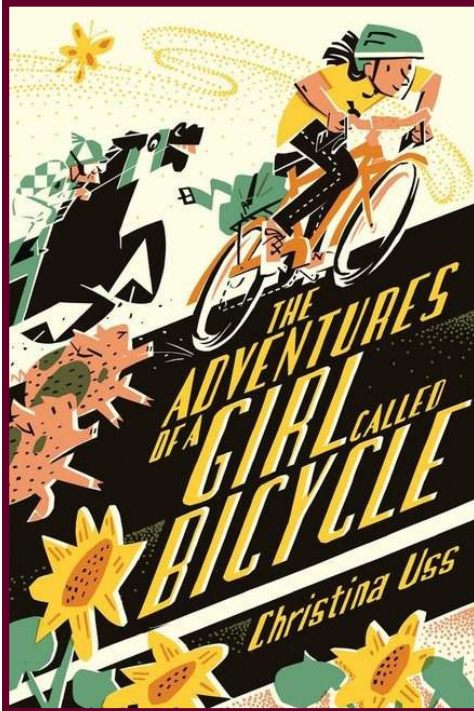
